#### **AGENDA**

#### Call to Order

The virtual meeting of the MTB was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by Chair Jack Torres, Town of Bernalillo. Roll call was taken and the persons noted above were present.

#### Approval of Agenda for May 21, 2021

#### Reports

#### **♦Staff**

Steven Montiel, MPO Transportation Program Coordinator, reported that today's agenda items were reviewed by the TCC with the exception of the CEC report which is still under discussion.

Kendra Montanari, MPO Planning and Technical Services Manager, reported on: Bike to Wherever Day, the Active Transportation Dashboard (for bicyclists and pedestrians) on the MRCOG website, current technical services underway, ongoing the traffic counts and travel demand models, and revision underway for GIS.

#### **ACTION ITEMS**

#### Tab 2 R-21-03 MTB

#### Amending the FY 2020-2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Mr. Montiel presented R-21-03 MTB explaining that the amendments to the TIP have been requested by various agencies. This out-of-cycle TIP amendment will allow the allocation of large urban reserve funds and covid relief stimulus funds to be made to existing TIP projects. Mr. Montiel reviewed the technical document behind the scenario from the last MTB meeting. He noted that there remains a reserve of \$1 million unprogrammed with \$18 million to be approved today. The TPTG, the TCC and the MPO staff recommend approval. Mr. Montiel reviewed each amendment and stood for questions.

#### **Action Taken:**

Ms. Borrego made a motion to:

#### APPROVE R-21-03 MTB AS PRESENTED

The motion was seconded by Diane Gibson, City of Albuquerque and passed unanimously on a vote of 22 in favor and none opposed. See attendance sheet above.

#### **DISCUSSION AND INFORMATION ITEMS**

#### Tab 3 NMDOT Transportation Project Fund Call for Projects

Mr. Montiel presented the NMDOT Call for Projects explaining that NMDOT had extended the deadline for the Call and also stated that a frequently asked document was released by the DOT which gave MPO's the option to not rank proposals and give the responsibility to the NMDOT District 3. Mr. Montiel asked if the Board would allow for the MPO staff to transfer those responsibilities to the District and write the Cabinet Secretary requesting this action. The Board agreed.

Mr. Montiel thanked the NMDOT for this funding opportunity and recognizing the importance of our metropolitan area receiving potential funding. He then stood for questions.

David Quintana, NMDOT, reiterated that this source would be a reoccurring funding stream. Mr. Montiel noted that any potential awards would be amended into the TIP through our formal process.

The MPO will, Mr. Montiel said, be responsible for uploading local agency applications to the NMDOT FTP site. The Board agreed to this.

#### Tab 4 Review of Revisions to the Community Engagement Committee Charter

Mr. Montiel said that this is only a discussion item for a charter for a subcommittee and that today there is a request to establish a committee for input. He explained that in 2019, the PIC (Public Involvement Committee) was disbanded and work began to update the process. The intent of the CEC is to achieve accessibility and participation of the communities.

Jake Wolff, MRCOG Transportation Planner, presented background information an update on the revisions to the Community Engagement Committee charter. The draft maintains the election of officers in Section II, Subsection C as discussed by the MTB in December 2020. Mr. Wolff said that the MRCOG is currently developing protocols for more accessible documents and MRMPO is taking steps to expand our capacity for language accessibility resources. The draft charter revisions will be posted for a 45 day period of public review and

feedback in June and comments will be compiled and presented as an information item to the Board prior to drafting a resolution for approval.

Mr. Wolff said that over the summer of 2021, the staff will recruit community members to serve on the committee, implementing our accessibility protocols.

Mr. Wolff stood for questions.

Ms. Patterson asked about adding the words "as required by law" on page 30. Mr. Wolff said he will consult with the MRCOG counsel. Another suggestion was to include "pre-K through 12 on page 34. Mr. Montiel noted that we are following federal regulations and all State laws are being followed as well and the intent of this sub-committee is to do a better job of outreach.

Mr. Montiel reminded those present that the COG will not be open on June 18<sup>th</sup> in recognition of the Juneteenth celebration and he also asked members to consider skipping a July meeting.

18	political subdivision, held for the purpose of formulating public policy, including the
19	development of personnel policy, rules, regulations or ordinances, discussing public
20	business or for the purpose of taking any action within the authority of or the delegated
21	authority of any board, commission or other policymaking body are declared to be public
22	meetings open to the public at all times, except as otherwise provided in the constitution
23	of New Mexico or the Open Meetings Act. No public meeting, once convened, that is
24	otherwise required to be open pursuant to the Open Meetings Act shall be closed or

dissolved into small groups or committees for the purpose of permitting the closing of

the meeting; and

WHEREAS, Section 10-15-1 (C) allows a public body to provide members of a public body to participate in a meeting of the public body by means of a conference telephone or other similar communicating equipment when it is otherwise difficult or impossible for the member to attend the meeting in person, provided that each member participating, by conference telephone can be identified when speaking, all participants are able to hear each other at the same time and members of the public attending the meeting are able to hear any member of the public body who speaks during the meeting; and

WHEREAS, Section 10-15-1(D) of the Open Meetings Act requires the Board of Directors of the Mid-Region Council of Governments (MRCOG) of New Mexico to determine annually what constitutes reasonable notice of its public meetings; and

WHEREAS, Section 10-15-4 of the Open Meetings Act provides that all provisions of the Open Meetings Act shall be enforced by the attorney general or by the district attorney in the county of jurisdiction. However, nothing in that act shall prevent an individual from independently applying for enforcement through the district courts, provided that the individual first provides written notice of the claimed violation to the public body and that the public body has denied or not acted on the claim within fifteen days of receiving it. A public meeting held to address a claimed violation of the Open Meetings Act shall include a summary of comments made at the meeting at which the claimed violation occurred; and

WHEREAS, Section 10-15-4(c) of the Open Meetings Act provides that the district courts of the state shall have jurisdiction, upon the application of any person to enforce the purpose of the Open Meetings Act, by injunction, mandamus or other appropriate order. The court shall award costs and reasonable attorney fees to any

person who is successful in bringing a court action to enforce the provisions of the Open Meetings Act. If the prevailing party in a legal action brought under this section is a public body defendant, it shall be awarded court costs. A public body defendant that prevails in court action brought under this section shall be awarded its reasonable attorney fees from the plaintiff if the plaintiff brought the action without sufficient information and belief that good grounds supported it.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Metropolitan Transportation Board, of the Mid-Region Metropolitan Planning Organization, a division of the Mid-Region Council of Governments of New Mexico, that:

- 1. Regular meetings of the Metropolitan Transportation Board, and the Transportation Coordinating Committee, shall ordinarily be held as established by the individual boards at their last meeting of the calendar year. For the purposes of regular meetings, notice requirements are met if notice of the date, time, place, and information on how the public may obtain an agenda, is placed as a legal notice in newspapers of general circulation in the state at least ten (10) days in advance of the meeting date. Written notice shall also be mailed to those broadcast stations licensed by the Federal Communications Commission and newspapers of general circulation which have made a written request of the MRCOG for notice of public meetings. A proposed agenda will be posted in the offices of the MRCOG one week before the meeting, located at 809 Copper Ave. NW Albuquerque, New Mexico; and will be available on the MRCOG website at <a href="https://www.mrcog-nm.gov">www.mrcog-nm.gov</a> one week before the meeting; and
- 2. The final agenda, with all supporting documents will be posted in the offices of the MRCOG and will also be available on the MRCOG website

- Members of the Metropolitan Transportation Board, and the Transportation
   Coordinating Committee may participate by teleconference in any meetings
   that are held in the MRCOG Conference Room; and
- 4. Special meetings of the Metropolitan Transportation Board, and the Transportation Coordinating Committee, may be called by the Chairman or a majority of the members upon three (3) days' notice. For the purposes of special meetings, notice requirements shall be met by posting notices in the offices of the MRCOG. Facsimile notice of such meetings shall be provided to those broadcast stations licensed by the Federal Communications Commission and newspapers of general circulation that have made a written request of the MRCOG for notice of public meetings; and
- 5. Emergency meetings of the Metropolitan Transportation Board, and the Transportation Coordinating Committee are meetings called under circumstances which demand immediate action by those boards. Although the boards would avoid emergency meetings whenever possible, such circumstances may occasionally arise. Emergency meetings of those boards may be called by the Chairman or a majority of the members upon twenty-four (24) hours' notice. For the purposes of emergency meetings, notice requirements shall be met by posting notices in the offices of the MRCOG. Facsimile notice of such meetings shall be provided to those broadcast stations licensed by the Federal Communications Commission and newspapers of general circulation that have made a written request of

- Pursuant to Section 10-15-1(H)(I) NMSA 1978, the Metropolitan

  Transportation Board, and the Transportation Coordinating Committee may close a meeting to the public if the subject matter of such discussion or action is included in Subsection I of the Open Meetings Act, Section 10-15-1

  NMSA 1978. If any such board meeting/ is closed pursuant to Section 10-15-1(H)(I) NMSA 1978, such closure:

- (a) if made in an open meeting, shall be approved by a majority vote of a quorum of the members of such board and authority for the closure and subject to be discussed shall be stated in the motion calling for the vote on a closed meeting. The vote on a closed meeting shall be taken in an open meeting and the vote of each individual member is to be recorded in the minutes. Only those subjects announced or voted upon prior to closure by such board may be discussed in a closed meeting; and
- (b) if called for when such boards are not in an open meeting, the closed meeting shall not be held until public notice, appropriate under the circumstances, stating the specific provision of law authorizing the closed meeting and subject matter is given to the members and to the general public; and
- (c) Notwithstanding any provision, the Chairman may establish such additional notice as may be deemed advisable.
