

Proposed Amendment to the Albuquerque Metropolitan Planning Area (AMPA) Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

This proposal will amend the current FFY 2020 – FY 2025 TIP (effective as of October 1, 2019) (The FFY for the TIP refers to the Federal Fiscal Year which runs from October 1st through September 30th.)

An amendment to the TIP has been proposed.

This proposal is open for public comment. All comments should be received on or before close of business the day before the meeting noted. There is opportunity for further public comment at the Metropolitan Transportation Board (MTB) meeting to be held **September 17th**, **2021** at **10:00** am at the Mid-Region Council of Governments Board Room.

After approval of the TIP Amendment by the MTB, the amendment is combined into the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) Amendment proposal and sent to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) for concurrence. Once federal concurrence is received, the amendments will be incorporated into the official TIP (approx. 2-3 months after MTB approval).
